### **HOW DOES IT WORK?**



**SET THE BUDGET.** Teachers or school administrators establish the budget that will be given to the students (\$2,000 to \$10,000 is common). Sources include PTAs or discretionary spending.



**CONFIGURE THE APP.** Teachers can configure the PB program for the school in the FirstRoot app.



**LAUNCH THE PB PROGRAM.** Students will create, refine, vote & fund school improvement proposals.



### IMPLEMENT WINNING PROPOSALS.

The school begins implementing the winning student-created proposals.
